STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS FOR SPECIAL ADMIT - MIDDLE/HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

APPLY TO ANTELOPE VALLEY COLLEGE

✓ Go to www.avc.edu and apply online. After you submit your application and are accepted, you will receive your myAVC account information.

6 GO TO YOUR MIDDLE/HIGH SCHOOL

- Complete the form and pick courses with your parent/guardian and your principal/designee.

 Make sure to select alternate courses according to the principal/designee's recommendations.
- ✓ Get a current unofficial copy of your middle/high school transcripts.
- ✓ Make sure you get all the required signatures before submitting the form to the AVC Admissions and Records Office.

AVUHSD does not grant high school credit for courses that a student takes prior to their entry into 9th grade.

AVUHSD requires that students have a cumulative 2.0 GPA to take vocational courses and a cumulative 2.5 GPA to take academic courses.

@ GO TO THE AVC ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS OFFICE

- ✓ Bring ALL your paperwork (Special Admit form, Transcripts) to the AVC Registration Office.
- After admission to AVC, you will be able to register durign Open Registration provided all paperwork is
- complete. If your packet is not complete, you will be directed back to your school to obtain any missing signatures or paperwork.
- All students 14 and under need to meet with the Dean of Enrollment Services before enrolling at AVC.

@ GO TO THE AVC ASSESSMENT OFFICE

Take the AVC Assessment test for courses with prerequisites. You do not need an appointment to take the test. The test takes approximately 2 hours to complete.

- ✓ If you need help interpreting your assessment test scores.
- If you have a question on a course that has a prerequisite.

©REGISTER ONLINE using your myAVC account

- Register online during Open Registration using your myAVC account.
- Eligibility for courses does not guarantee that a seat will be available at the time of registration.
- Special Admit students are not permitted to audit courses at AVC.
- All courses taken at AVC are for college credit. All applicable registration fees must be paid by posted deadlines.

OPAY FOR YOUR COURSES

- Pay for all applicable fees online or at the Cashier's office by posted deadlines.
- ✓ Some courses have other applicable fees.



Title 5 of the state Educational Code (48800.5) and 76001 (a), (b) and (h) indicates that minor students may take college classes that are for "advanced scholastic or vocational education and for which they have demonstrated adequate preparation in the discipline to be studied and have availed themselves of all opportunities to enroll in an equivalent course at their school of attendance." The intent is to provide educational enrichment opportunities for eligible minor students. Students who enroll in college level classes will find them challenging; therefore, the student will need to demonstrate that they can meet the academic requirements to enroll in the class.

Admissions Requirements:

- AVC Admissions application Apply for admission online at www.avc.edu. Click the "Apply Online" link from the main page.
- Special Admittance form (completely filled out with all required signatures present on form). This form needs to be filled out each semester. They are available to students after the schedule of classes becomes available online.

Course Requirements may include:

- Some performance classes have an audition requirement prior to enrollment.
- Students interested in visual or graphic arts classes must present samples of previous work to be considered by the division dean and instructors in the discipline area.
- For some classes there is an age limit, which is based on a liability issue or established by a state regulatory body.
- Physical Education Classes: Minor students must have completed the 8th grade to enroll in a physical education (PE) class. Only 10% of enrolled students in any section of a PE course may be comprised of Special Admit students.

Registration:

- · Special Admit students register online during Open Registration after all paperwork has been approved.
- All prerequisites, co requisites, and special requirements for a course must be met.
- All applicable registration fees must be paid by posted deadlines.
- Special Admit students are not permitted to audit courses at AVC.

Transcripts: All classes taken at AVC will appear on a student's AVC transcript. If a student would like his/her school to receive a copy of his/her transcript, it is the student's responsibility to request an official transcript by completing a Transcript Request Form at the Transcript Office.

Student Records / Privacy: California Education Code 49061 states that parents of community college students do not have a right of access to their children's student records, regardless of whether the student is under the age of 18. In addition, Section 1232g of Title 20 of United States code states there is a general right of parental access to student records, but not for college students, regardless of age. Therefore, Antelope Valley College cannot permit parent(s) to request or obtain their child's student records.

Denial: California Education Code 48800 (b): If the governing board denies a request for a special admit student, who is identified as highly gifted, the board shall issue its written recommendation and the reasons for the denial within 60 days. The written recommendation and denial shall be issued at the next regularly scheduled board meeting that falls at least 30 days after the request has been submitted.



Credit Courses Not Applicable to the Associate Degree and Certificate Programs

Special admittance minor students cannot take credit courses that are not applicable to an Associate degree and/or certificate program, or courses that have enrollment limitations or restrictions. These include the following:
